Personal Development Opportunities across School

Y5 & Y6 Fire & Rescue talk

At the beginning of this term, we welcomed Chris, a Home and Community Safety Advisor from Oxfordshire Fire and Rescue. He spoke to the children about the importance of having a safety escape plan in our houses and how to remain safe at home. Our Y6 children had remembered lots from their Junior Citizenship trip last term, and wowed him with their knowledge!

KS2 Quadkids

Our KS2 Quadkids teams have shown extraordinary teamwork, grit, and determination this season. Both teams placed first in the initial round at Millbrook, earning a place at the Area Finals at Tilsley Park on 25th June. Our Year 6 team did us proud, placing 7th out of 10 at the area finals – a brilliant achievement! Our Year 4 team came 1st and qualified for the County Finals – one of only 10 teams out of over 200 to do so.

Y1 OAA

Year 1 have been hugely enthusiastic about their OAA sessions with Miss Biles! They have embraced every session and have worked incredibly hard to help us maintain our forest area. This term, they have been helping to dig out the mud kitchen, as well as learning how to use a range of tools!







Tennis Workshop

For the last few years, Mrs Rose has organised a tennis workshop for children in Reception to Year 2, and this year was no different.

Each class in these year groups benefitted from some expert coaching and the opportunity to learn some new skills.

The event, for all Trust primary schools, was designed to allow children to get to know others from across the Trust, compete in a number of traditional and also non-traditional Olympic events whilst also having fun. The event took place on a very warm and sunny day, but the children were as enthusiastic as ever, showing off their athletic prowess!

Over the course of the year, children in Year 2 - Year 6 have been busy working towards their Character and Citizenship Awards. On 20th June, we welcomed Chris Salt, a Director of the Board of Trustees for Cambrian Learning Trust, who presented over 80 children across the school with awards ranging from bronze to platinum. 14 children in Year 6 who achieved platinum were also invited to a special ceremony at The Beacon where they were presented with their certificates and badges by the High Sheriff of Oxfordshire, John May CVO OBE DL.

Early Years

Acorns: Acorns have been preparing for starting school in September! The home corner has been a school where the children have had the chance to wear school uniform, pack a bag and lunchbox. We have been very impressed with their independent skills, particularly when dressing themselves! This term, we have made visits to the Reception classrooms and have met our new teachers which the children have thoroughly enjoyed. In between school visits, we have enjoyed the lovely weather and have had a teddy bears picnic in the garden where all children bought a teddy from home to take to the picnic.

We also held our graduation party Monday to celebrate our children's journeys with us. We said goodbye and good luck to our children as they move on to the next adventure of school. Luckily, the sun shone for us and the children sang a song for their grown ups and we all enjoyed an ice pop and a cup cake after.

<u>Reception</u>: This term, Reception have been learning all about minibeasts and water. We have enjoyed lots of minibeast hunts in our outdoor area and have explored water in lots of different ways. This term, we have been proud of the way in which the children have embraced their transition to Year 1. We can't believe it is the end of the children's year with us! What a brilliant year it has been and we look forward to watching them continue on their learning journey in Year 1.

Key Stage 1

<u>Year 1:</u> This term started with all of Year 1 (the staff included!) having their hats stolen by a bear! Thankfully, after using our brilliant writing skills and creating letters to ask for them back, the bear returned our hats and all was well. We then went on to write some fantastic stories based on the book 'I want my hat back'. In maths, we have found out all about halves and quarters and then moved on to telling time to the o'clock and half past. In history, we have learnt about John Betjeman and were able to see lots linking to him on our walk around Wantage. For art & design this term, we have created some beautiful mixed media pieces of artwork inspired by Yayoi Kusama - these have lots of bright colours and dots. Our science learning has been focused on plants and we've enjoyed investigating different types of leaves, learning more about the seasons and also the different parts of a plant.

<u>Year 2:</u> As the school year draws to a close, we want to take a moment to reflect on what a fantastic year it has been. The children have made incredible progress and developed so many new skills – we are so proud of each and every one of them!

This term, our learning centred around the magical story The Minpins by Roald Dahl. We journeyed into the mysterious Forest of Sin, encountered the fearsome Gruncher, and used our imaginations to describe this terrifying creature in vivid detail. Thankfully, Little Billy saved the day! We all wrote thoughtful letters to thank him and shared the exciting adventures the Minpins have had since the Gruncher was defeated.

In maths, we focused on measurement and statistics. The children worked brilliantly to collect, interpret, and represent data – skills that linked seamlessly with our computing lessons. We even created our own pictograms to showcase the information we gathered!

We ended the term on a high with a fantastic rounders tournament. It was wonderful to see the enthusiasm, teamwork, and sportsmanship from both classes – a perfect celebration of the children's hard work and team spirit.

As we say goodbye to Year 2, we feel incredibly lucky to have spent this year with such a kind, curious, and enthusiastic group of learners. While we are sad to see the year come to an end, we're excited to hear about all the amazing things they will go on to do in Year 3. Have a safe, sunny, and fun-filled summer!

Key Stage 2

<u>Year 3:</u> In Year 3 this term, we have been looking at sustainability and how to make the future better for further generations. The children have been very engaged in this and it has been lovely to see. Sycamore class have been creating posters too, which they will bring home at the end of term.

In maths, we have been looking at money and mass and capacity. We have been using measuring cylinders to see how accurate our readings have been. The children have also been looking at certain amounts of money and how much change they would receive. You can test them on this when they go out shopping!

Our writing this term has been based on the book "The Great Kapok Tree". The children have imitated the story and made it their own, which have been lovely to read.

Sports days were a great success and it was so lovely to see so many smiles on the children's faces. Well done to all that took part 🙂

We have been putting our sandwich making skills to good use through out design & technology unit, which has also meant that the children have enjoyed a picnic with their classmates.

<u>Year 4:</u> Year 4 have had a wonderfully busy and exciting term. We were thrilled to welcome a Roman soldier into school. He delivered an engaging and interactive talk that brought history to life, followed by a fun and energetic drill session in the playground.

We have also visited Willow Walk Nature Reserve to observe the habitats in and around the brook. It was a fantastic opportunity for the children to see a range of wildlife and deepen their understanding of local ecosystems.

We are incredibly proud of all the children for approaching their Multiplication Tables Check with such confidence. They have worked exceptionally hard to learn their times tables this year, and their results truly reflect that effort. You will find your child's results included in their end-of-year report.

In computing, the children have been busy creating their own podcasts. They've learned how to record, layer, and edit audio, as well as how to add jingles and sound effects — producing some fantastic results. It has been a fantastic year for Year 4, and we have thoroughly enjoyed teaching this brilliant group of children.

<u>Year 5:</u> Year 5 have had a fantastic final term filled with creativity and curiosity across the curriculum. In art & design, they explored the technique of batik, inspired by the landscape artwork of Anna Dillon, working sensibly with hot wax to create their own vibrant designs. In geography, they learned about a range of natural disasters, gaining an understanding of their causes and impacts. English lessons took them on an imaginative journey as they wrote stories about a day in the life of a child on another planet, using figurative language to paint vivid pictures for the reader. Meanwhile, in maths, they developed their measuring skills by learning to use protractors accurately to measure and draw angles.

<u>Year 6</u>: As the summer term draws to a close, our Year 6 students have showcased remarkable creativity, resilience, and teamwork through their Enterprise Project. After weeks of planning and preparation, it was truly wonderful to see them set up stalls after school and proudly sell to Charlton families. From ice cream and sweets to handmade bracelets, cakes, football challenges, and many more imaginative ideas, each child took on the roles of entrepreneur, designer, marketer, and salesperson. Their confidence grew as they greeted customers, handled money, and shared the stories behind their products and experiences—skills that reflect real-world enterprise learning

Meanwhile, in design & technology this half term, our young engineers have been hard at work researching, designing, and building moving fairground rides. Using computer programs to test speed and timing, they've demonstrated impressive problem-solving skills and attention to detail. Seeing their concepts come to life has been a joy to behold.

We are incredibly proud of the dedication and enthusiasm Year 6 have shown across all areas of learning. As they prepare for their next academic chapter, we know they are more than ready. We will miss them terribly, but we're excited to see how their talents continue to grow. Well done to all—here's to the bright futures ahead!

Holiday requests



There is no automatic entitlement in law to time off in school time to go on holiday, and all schools in Oxfordshire are encouraged to adopt a policy of not authorising requests for holidays.

Please be aware that as a school, we are unable to authorise absence for holidays during term-time. If a term-time holiday is taken, the absence will be recorded as unauthorised.

Authorised absences are mornings or afternoons away from school for reasons such as illness, medical/dental appointments which unavoidably fall in school time, emergencies or other unavoidable causes. If your child has an medical or dental appointment that falls within the school day, you may be asked to send confirmation of the appointment.

Talk to children about who their trusted adults are, and who they can approach if they encounter any issues whilst out and about



Every year people drown both at home and on holiday because they don't take simple precautions, so reaching people with water safety messages is vital.

We want people to enjoy the water safely. Please help to avoid another tragic summer this year by spreading the following water safety advice far and wide:



LOOK OUT FOR LIFEGUARDS

If you're looking for a place to cool off, always find a lifeguarded swimming site



Water at open and inland sites is often much colder than it looks. Cold water can affect your ability to swim and self-rescue



Always swim parallel to the shore, that way you're never too far away from it





Currents in the water can be very strong. If you find yourself caught in a current – don't swim against it – you'll tire yourself out. Stay calm, swim with the current and call for help



Always bring a friend when you go swimming so if anything goes wrong, you've got someone there to help
