## Arrangements for arriving at school

Please arrive at the blue gates at 8.40am.

Early morning learning begins from 8.40am.

Our gates will be open from 8.40am until 8.55am and will close <u>promptly</u> at this time.

The morning register will be taken at 8.55am.

Formal learning begins from 8.55am.

Should you arrive later than 8.55am, please use the gate buzzer. All children who arrive after 8.55am will need to be accompanied by their adult to the school office.

In case of absence, please telephone the school office before the start of the school day.

## Attendance

As a school, we are unable to authorise holidays, (this includes attending weddings), and as such all absences will be recorded as **unauthorised**.

We encourage parents/carers to make medical and dental appointments out of school hours where possible, and we will be requesting that families provide confirmation of these appointments should they fall during the school day.

Should a child's absence drop below 94%, a letter will issued to families. Where a child is late 3 times in a term, a letter will be issued and punctuality will be closely monitored.

Please note that penalty notices could be issued for unauthorised absences including persistent lateness. This is £60 per child, per adult in the house.

#### ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL

Children are required by law to attend school 190 days per year. The Government states that every pupil's attendance should be at least 95%.

## Arrangements for leaving school

In Year 6, the children will exit via Acacia or through the blue gates. We may come out with the children at the end of the day, but we do not hand children over to adults on a 1:1 basis.

Parents/carers must inform classroom adults of any changes to collection routines either face-to-face at morning drop off or via communication to the office.

Please note, children do not require rucksacks or bags. However, a book bag is required.

For the summer term, grey/black shorts or a blue gingham dress are suitable. Black sandals with a secured strap around the back of the foot are permitted.

The weather is often changeable so all children should have a waterproof coat available in school everyday.



## **Uniform**









A watch and one small plain stud in each ear lobe only - no other studs are allowed. For PE these must be removed or covered with microporous tape provided from home. No other jewelry is permitted.

One simple black belt only.

Longer hair, past shoulder length, needs to be tied back using small, discreet clips, ties or hair bands.

Extremely short razor lines cut into the hair, non-natural colours, fully or partially shaved hair, or excessive hair gel are unacceptable.

Colourful hair braids are not appropriate during term time and are best enjoyed during the school holidays.

No make-up, transfer tattoos or nail varnish should be worn to school.



## PE uniform



PE uniform should be worn to school on the days of the week which children have PE lessons. For those children attending TA Sports after school, they may also come to school wearing their PE uniform.

White round neck t-shirt

Black/navy PE shorts or black/navy track-suit bottoms/black or navy sports leggings

Plain black sweatshirt or black PE specific jumper with school logo

**Appropriate sports trainers -** Fashion trainers, for example, Converse, are not appropriate for sports and should not be worn.

Please note, sports kits of any kind are not permitted. Should PE uniform not be provided, a phone call home requesting that uniform is brought in time for the lesson will be made.



## Snacks and Lunch time arrangements

To perform well in school, children need to have a healthy, balanced diet. This aids their concentration, and ultimately their performance throughout the school day.

- Children are encouraged to bring a snack to eat at break time. We advocate healthy snacks at break times. Ideally, this should be an item of fruit or vegetable.
- Children must bring their own reuseable water bottle from home each day. Please make sure they are clearly named. Throughout the day, children have access to drinking water in the classrooms so that they may top up their bottle. Please note, squash bottles (such as Prime) are not permitted.
- We are a 'no nuts' school as there are several pupils and staff who have allergies to these items. Please ensure that children do not bring items of food that contain nuts. This includes Nutella.

## Our curriculum



#### **Curriculum Overview**

#### English

The term will begin with a focus on a text by Shaun Tan. 'The Arrival', The text is a wordless picture book about a man who is forced to leave his home to find work and a better life for his family. The children will be writing their own version of the story using expanded noun phrases and cohesion before moving on to writing informative guides for people who have migrated.

#### Maths

In Maths, we will start the term by deepening our knowledge and understanding of place value and properties of number. Children will be comparing and ordering numbers up to 10 million, rounding numbers to the required degree of accuracy and working with negative numbers. We will then be moving on to the four number operations.

#### Science

Our science lessons will focus on the human body and the children will learn about the circulatory and digestive systems. By the end of this unit of work, children will be able to explain the main functions of the heart. blood and blood vessels. Children will also investigate different food groups and find out why a variety of food is important for a healthy diet.

#### French

In this term's French lessons with Mrs Kent. children will be learning a French song, using French dictionaries to find unknown vocabulary within the song and then learning numbers up to sixty.

#### **PSHE**

Our Jigsaw unit for this term Is "Being me in my world". The children will reflect on their goals for the year ahead and will develop their understanding of their rights, whilst understanding that in some areas of the world the rights for children are not met. The children will then reflect on how their actions affect others both locally and globally and consider how their behaviour can impact on a group.

#### Computing

In computing this term, children will be learning how to design a website. The children will evaluate what makes a good website, consider how to lay out a webpage, learn about copyright and navigational paths. We are very lucky to have Ms Boaz teaching computing in Year 6 this year.

#### Geography

In Geography this term, we will be covering two units of work: Settlements and Migration: South America. In Settlements and Migration, children will be looking at different settlement patterns, the reasons why people move including refugees. For our South America Unit, we will be looking at the geographical features of the continent as well as comparing Lima with a location in the United Kinadom.

#### DT

The children will design, make and evaluate a fabric doorstop. Children will analyse a range of different materials and shapes that would best suit the brief. Once they have designed and chosen the materials for their doorstop, children will practise their sewing skills by making their designed doorstop.

#### Music

In Year 6, we will continue to use Music Express. The first unit is "World Unite" and will focus on a step dance performance. Children will learn about beat syncopation, pitch and harmony and consider how music is a universal language. The unit will combine singing, movement and dance.

#### P.E

This term will include swimming sessions for both classes. Miss Joyce's class will swim first, followed by Mrs Donnison's class. These sessions will be on Thursday mornings. When the children are not swimming, the PE lessons in school will focus on rounders.

#### R.E

Our big question for this term is "Are all the saints encouraging role models?". The children will consider who or what motivates them as role models. They will then learn about different saints including the story of Stephen, the first Christian martyr, and also Mother Teresa.

## Homework

Home learning - handed out on a Wednesday, due back in the following Monday Maths homework - handed out on a Friday, due back the following Wednesday

Home learning - English based task (including daily reading and spellings each week). The main task could be grammar, punctuation, reading comprehension or a writing activity. This should take up to 30 minutes to complete.

Maths homework - this will have a fluency task designed to improve recall of number facts or to develop arithmetic skills. Times Table Rockstars should be used at home at least twice a week.

Late homework - one extra day extension. If homework is not handed in the following day, children will be given the opportunity to complete it at break time.

SATs are standardised assessment tests administered by primary schools in England to children in Year 2 and Year 6 to check their educational progress.


## Communication

If your email address, phone number or home address change, please inform the school office ASAP so that we can ensure our emergency contact details are correct





## Mobile phones

We understand that children do bring mobile phones to school.

However, mobile phones <u>must be turned off</u> on entry to the school site each day and for the duration of the day.

Furthermore, mobile phones must not be used by children when leaving the classrooms and whilst still on the school site at the end of the day. This is to safeguard all children and adults on site.

If your child does bring their phone to school, we are not liable for any damage or even loss.



## What can you to do support your child?
