Below is a selection of Home Learning tasks for you to choose from. Complete one task each week and hand your work into your teacher in your homework book on a **Monday**. Your book will be checked and returned to you on the **Wednesday**. You may complete the activities in any order and there are more activities than you need to complete so that you have a choice. You are expected to spend between 25 - 30 minutes on your Home Learning.

Sharks

In Science we will be looking at sharks and their habitat. See if you can find 5 interesting facts about different sharks and where they live.

Observational drawing

In art we will be doing some observational drawing. Choose an object from home to draw, picking out as much detail as you can.

River Thames

Find some pictures of places along the River Thames. If you get the chance, go for a walk along the Thames and take some photos to show us.

Shape poem

Create a shape poem based on water. Perhaps it could be in the shape of an umbrella, a raindrop, or any other watery shape of your choice.

World rainfall

Research the annual rainfall in 5 different countries across the world and present your findings in any way you choose.

Ocean Life

Create a food chain for creatures that live in the water. Remember to start with the producer and use arrows to show "is eaten by".

Spellings

Practise learning your spellings for this term using your preferred method. Take a photo and send it in!
